Lawn Furniture Guidelines

- 1. All decorative embellishment visible from the streets must be approved in writing by the Architectural Control Committee as per Article 1, Section 21, Paragraph 7 of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions.
- 2. Decorative appurtenances such as sculptures, birdbaths, birdhouses, fountains are allowed in the garden area/section of the front lawn of the residence only. These items cannot be placed in the lawn area and will be considered in violation.
- 3. Lawn chairs are prohibited on the front lawn, but can be placed on porch if room allows. (this one is still in works)
- 4. Only furniture that is intended for outdoor use can be utilized. Chairs and/or benches made for indoor use are strictly prohibited.
- 5. Benches are allowed on a case-by-case basis and are subject to approval by the Architectural Control Committee based on the following criteria.

Guidelines

- Must fit the size and aesthetic of the yard and be situated in such a way that it does not impede or block public foot traffic.
- Must be maintained and cleaned. (i.e. free from dirt, mold and mildew, fade free and without rust) Failure to maintain the bench will be considered a violation, up to fine(s) and permanent removal.
- Bench cannot be in the form of a swing, or swing with a metal or wood frame. Benches/swings of this kind may only go in the backyard, not the front yard.
- Bench size may not exceed ???? (Pending confirmation)

Materials Allowed:

- Concrete
- Natural Wood
- Synthetic Wood Look (Resin is allowed)
- Powder Coated Metal

Prohibited Materials:

- Plastic
- Fabric or Fabric Accents
- Aluminum
